



March 2025 Recycling Tips

In order to recycle we need to reduce our waste stream and then reuse, repurpose or donate items no longer needed.

We have several local area thrift stores that are willing to accept your donations of gently used items from clothing to furniture. We also have local programs that will take your donations of old bicycles and fix them up for the next person that can get use out of them or blankets and clothes or toiletries. Unless it is a single use item or completely destroyed chances are it can be reused somehow and if not, hopefully recycled rather than becoming refuse.

REDUCE WASTE!

- Use refillable containers rather than single use cups and drinks.
- Buy items with less packaging, especially plastic packaging.
- Buy bulk and share or split as much as possible to cut down on packaging.
- Repurpose items you already have as often as possible instead of buying new.
- Use washable containers rather than plastic sandwich and snack bags.

REUSE ITEMS!

- Repair items that are broken instead of throwing them away such as games, sewing a torn shirt.
- Find a new use for those old sweaters – turn them into pillow covers. Have some old jeans? Make a new quilt.
- Use refillable & reusable containers such reusable beverage containers instead of single use or regular plates instead of paper plates.
- Use items such as paper towel rolls, tissue boxes, etc. for craft projects rather than purchasing new items.
- Replacing something such as clothing, garden tools, kids' toys and bikes, etc.? Consider donating your gently used items to a local thrift store or charity.
- Donate old blankets to warming shelters and pet shelters.
- Repurpose containers such as jars for other items.
